● **LOW DIFFICULTY**  
For occasional hikers looking for contact with nature without being physically demanding. It is important to emphasize that, in Cerro Guido, all the hikes have sections of uneven terrain, often without trails or following trails marked by animals.

● **MEDIUM DIFFICULTY**  
For regular walkers or occasional walkers in good physical condition.

● **HIGH DIFFICULTY**  
These hikes are the most physically demanding, are intended for experienced hikers looking for the challenge of a hill. Recommended boots and technical clothing. Poles included.

# Practical information

To fully enjoy your experience in Patagonia, we invite you to read our recommendations on the type of clothing to wear.

In Patagonia, the weather is very changeable: it is not uncommon to experience all four seasons in a single day, or in just a few hours!

The summer (from December to March) is not very hot, with temperatures averaging 16 degrees Celsius. It can also be rainy and windy, with summer being the season of the strongest winds (over 80 km/h.). Therefore, to enjoy your rides, it is key to have the right clothing. **We recommend synthetic, quick-drying clothes** and avoid cotton and jeans: if they get wet, they keep the body cold and take a long time to dry.

## What to bring?

**Pants:** It is ideal to wear long trekking pants of light, quick-drying fabric. Shorts are optional, they are not very useful.

**First Layers:** T-shirts or long-sleeved shirts are required. Short sleeve shirts are optional.

**Thermal layers:**

- Polar (can be of different thicknesses).
- Down jacket (thin).
- Windproof and waterproof jacket, hopefully breathable, gore-tex for example. It is the garment that you cannot miss for your walks. We do not recommend a plastic poncho, as it is easy to break in the wind.

**Accessories:** thin gloves and a hat, scarf or Buff-type neck gaiter, temperature changes can be abrupt, even in summer.

**Rain pants:** another must-have, always carry them in your backpack when you go out for a walk.

**Refillable bottle (750 ml or 1 Lt):** to stay hydrated during the day and avoid disposable water bottles.

**Comfortable walking shoes:** For our hikes, we recommend hiking boots: the terrain can be quite uneven with dense vegetation, it is better to have a good sole and ankle support. For horseback riding, a pair of sneakers is sufficient or comfortable shoes that are not too thick to fit in the stirrups.

**Sun protection:** sunscreen factor 30 minimum and sunglasses (category 3). Patagonia has a strong solar radiation in summer, many times you won't feel it with the wind and the clouds, you will not feel the heat, that is why sunscreen is essential. Hat optional sun hat (don't blow away in the wind!)

**Daypack (25-30 lt):** very useful to carry your water, coat, picnic or whatever you deem necessary for your ride.

**Dry bags:** a useful detail to wrap your belongings in the backpack and prevent them from getting wet.

# Conservation Safari

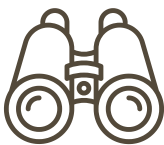

# Wildlife



This excursion offers a closer look at the heart of the Estancia and how we promote **the coexistence of cattle ranching and wildlife conservation.**

We travel in 4x4 vehicles to the Condorera sector, equipped with binoculars and field guides providing detailed information about the area. Along the way, we explore part of the Cerro Guido Conservation Foundation's project: tracking wildlife movements, reviewing camera trap footage, and observing firsthand the most significant outcomes of this initiative. The experience also includes learning about the use of livestock guardian dogs and their key role in the Estancia's conservation work.

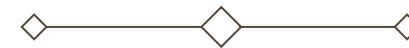






# Conservation Safari

THIS EXCURSION IS NOT INCLUDED IN THE ALL INCLUSIVE SHARED PROGRAM



With this activity we invite you to participate for a day in the conservation project of the Cerro Guido Foundation. You will discover the characteristic fauna of Patagonia and also the strategies that the Cerro Guido is achieving to develop a respectful livestock farming that coexists with native species. We leave by vehicle from Hotel Estancia Cerro Guido at dawn to accompany a member of our team of field trackers in their daily routine. We start with the puma research work at the Estancia, participating in activities such as observation with binoculars and camera traps. The tour includes short walks, without much difficulty. Towards the end of the morning, we will discover the work of the livestock guardian dogs and how they help the coexistence between conservation and human activity.

After lunch and a break, we will continue in the afternoon to the “Casa puma”, the operations center for the Cerro Guido Conservation Foundation. There we will watch an exciting video presentation, and then we will have a final field trip at sunset, where we will see the research work being carried out in the Sierra del Toro.

# Puesto Sarmiento - Gunther Plüschow



Through cattle fields we drive to Puesto Sarmiento, this iconic place is located on the shores of the namesake lake and bordering Torres del Paine National Park. In the 1930's the German aviator Gunther Plüschow used Estancia Cerro Guido as a gateway for his explorations over the Patagonian mountain range and Lake Sarmiento as a base for his seaplane. During the visit to the post we will learn more about the life of this adventurer and we will also be able to walk and visit the lake.

# Full day Torres del Paine Northeast



This Overland combines landscapes of Estancia Cerro Guido with the northeastern sector of Torres del Paine National Park, our proximity to this protected area allows us to visit less explored areas, as well as some of the classic viewpoints of Torres del Paine. The excursion is a mixture of vehicle and easy hikes that will allow us to see part of the Las Chinas Valley, famous for its paleontological findings, from where we will have views of the Sierra Baguales and we will approach the Torres del Paine National Park through the Laguna Azul sector, where we will have lunch. During the afternoon we will tour the northeast of the park, an area known for the presence of wildlife and its views of the three granite towers of Paine, passing through Cañadón Macho and Cascada Paine, a mandatory photographic stop, to begin our return to the hotel from the Laguna Amarga sector.

# Full day Torres del Paine

INCLUDES ENTRANCE FEE TO TORRES DEL PAINE NATIONAL PARK



This excursion will take us through the trails that cover part of the 1814 km<sup>2</sup> of Torres del Paine National Park. From views of the Southern Ice Field, to the pampas and its fauna, we will explore the diverse landscapes offered by this biosphere reserve.

We leave the ranch towards Lago del Toro to approach Torres del Paine National Park from the south, from where it is possible to have a great panoramic view of its mountains, forests, lakes and glaciers. We enter the park through the Serrano River and continue to the Pingo River sector for a short hike to Grey Lake. Then we continue to Lake Pehoé to have lunch and visit the Salto Grande, one of the most scenic places in the park. In the afternoon we will visit the eastern sector of the park, passing by the viewpoint of Lake Nördenskjold and Lake Sarmiento, to finish at Cascada Paine and return to Cerro Guido from Laguna Amarga.

# Macizo Paine Lookout



This ride is a must for beginner riders or those who simply want to enjoy the natural beauty that surrounds our Estancia. We leave from our stable to the high part of la Estancia, the ride takes us through a gentle plain with the majestic Torres del Paine always in sight. On the way up we border a forest of Lenguas and Ñirres, native Patagonian trees. On the way back we drive through meadows and open fields where it is common to see native fauna such as guanacos, rheas and foxes, as well as horses and sheep.

# Puesto Marcou



We leave towards the lower sector of the Estancia, crossing the pampa that leads us in the direction of Puesto Marcou, an old settlement for the care of cattle, from where we can have a view of the Sierra Baguales in the distance. We continue up the slope of the Sierra Contreras, to return through the high sector of the ranch, with the Torres del Paine on the horizon. This ride covers different types of terrain where we can trot, gallop and enjoy the natural environment.

# Tegualda Lagoon



This ride takes us through the immensity of the Patagonian steppe. We leave towards the lower part of the estancia in the direction of Laguna Los Flamencos, a privileged place for bird watching. It is common to see groups of flamingos, ducks, geese, and rheas among others. Surrounded by the Sierra del Cazador, Sierra Baguales and the Paine Massif, this tour through the Pampa invites riders with some experience to practice trotting and galloping.

# Segunda Barranca



Varied in landscapes and types of terrain, this ride begins by climbing from our stable to the high part of the Sierra Contreras, from where we head to the Segunda Barranca sector, an old ranch that today is part of Cerro Guido. Continuing in a westerly direction, we will slowly enter a native Nothofagus forest. After the picnic lunch, we return through a sector of open pampas, accompanied by the presence of wildlife and the Torres del Paine as a backdrop.

Our experienced riders looking for excitement and natural beauty will love this ride, the longest and fastest we propose. We leave riding towards the lower part of the ranch, through plains and meadows we head towards the Las Flores sector, with the Sierra Baguales becoming more imposing as we go along. After a picnic lunch, we return through the upper part of the estancia, this time with the Paine Massif in sight. Throughout the route there are long stretches for trotting and galloping.

# Sarmiento Lake



Located within the Torres del Paine National Park, Lake Sarmiento is the largest of this nature reserve and is bordered to the east by the Estancia Cerro Guido. The hike takes place near the base of the Sierra del Toro, from where we descend slowly through the steppe to reach the southeast shore of the lake, where we will have a great view of the Paine Massif. There we can appreciate the thrombolites, calcium carbonate deposits characteristic of Lake Sarmiento and then return by a short and slightly steep climb.

# Bosquecito Lookout



This hike offers the possibility to depart on foot from the hotel and discover at your own pace the natural beauty that surrounds our Estancia. Following a beautiful creek lined with Lenga trees, a native Patagonian tree, you will reach the viewpoint, where you can enjoy a wide panorama, particularly of the majestic Torres del Paine and Lake Sarmiento. The hike has the advantage of having many open views, so the final destination will depend on how far you want to walk. The route is ideal for the observation of the typical Patagonian fauna such as guanacos, rheas, foxes and sheep.

# Sierra Baguales



One of the Estancia's most iconic landscapes, the mystical Sierra Baguales forms the natural border between Chile and Argentina and is also the site of recent paleontological and archaeological discoveries. The solitary and wild nature of this little-explored mountain range is a must-see for adventure enthusiasts. For this excursion, we head toward Puesto Las Flores, from where we begin a steep, off-trail ascent that will take us through hills covered in coirón to the base of the Sierra Baguales. A series of small lagoons, striking peaks, and herds of guanacos are part of the breathtaking landscape that accompanies us as we approach Cerro Ciudadela. The descent is through wide valleys, where you can still see herds of baguales, wild horses that once inhabited the area in large numbers and give this remote mountain range its name.

# Mirador Sierra Baguales



Shorter but more demanding, this excursion is a short version of our full day hike to the Sierra Baguales, where we will visit the Las Flores post, close to the border with Argentina, for a short but steep ascent to a viewpoint that will leave us in front of the Tridente and Ciudadela hills, some of the most imposing peaks of this mountain range. We will also have a view of the wide pampa that extends to the east, to then begin our descent through one of the valleys that will take us back to the starting point.

# Las Chinas Lookout



Off the beaten path, adventure enthusiasts will love this hike.

We leave the Cerro Guido hotel by car, taking a 40-minute drive to the Las Chinas Valley, a wild and less-explored area located in the northeast sector of the ranch.

Our hike takes us through open fields, following the Las Chinas River to the valley's only forest, composed of Lenga and Ñirre trees, native to Patagonia. There, we begin our ascent to the viewpoint, located high in the hills. The climb is strenuous, off-trail and over uneven terrain, but our efforts are rewarded when we reach a surprising viewpoint, not only for its spectacular views of Torres del Paine and its surroundings, but also for its mineral environment and its succession of very peculiar rock formations that will transport us to another time.

# Chenque Cerro Guido



An exciting challenge for our athletic hikers is to climb the highest peak in the Sierra Contreras and the mountain of our Estancia's namesake. At 1,270 meters above sea level, you'll discover an exceptional panorama, as well as a valuable archaeological monument, the Chenque, a large burial mound erected by the Aonikenk, an indigenous people of Patagonia, now extinct. We leave the hotel itself, hiking steadily uphill through open fields, until we reach the foot of the Sierra Contreras. From there, we begin a strenuous climb up the steep slope of the mountain, on rocky terrain and without a path, to a first plateau, where our efforts are rewarded by a magnificent view of the Sierra Baguales. To reach the summit of Cerro Guido, where the famous Chenque is located, we continue our ascent and cross another large, sloping plateau, following a more gradual and gentle climb. A spectacular 360-degree view awaits us, overlooking the surrounding valleys, mountain ranges, lakes, and glaciers, with the Torres del Paine in sight.

# Base of the Towers

INCLUDES ENTRANCE TO TORRES DEL PAINE NATIONAL PARK



One of Patagonia's classic hikes and the national park's main attraction, backpackers from around the world challenge themselves with this intense hike every year. For those who want to explore the Torres del Paine Mountains for a day, this experience is definitely worth it. We leave the hotel early to head to Torres del Paine National Park, where we begin our hike approaching the Paine Massif and facing the first major 2 km climb that will take us into the Ascencio Valley. We continue through the valley, passing Campamento Chileno and gradually ascending through a Lenga forest until we reach the foot of the glacial moraine that leads up to the Torres del Paine viewpoint. Probably the most challenging, the final hour of steep climb over rocky terrain takes us to one of Patagonia's most iconic landscapes: the three granite towers that give Torres del Paine its name.

# Cultural Estancia Tour



Our guided tour is an invitation to discover an authentic Patagonian Estancia, where not only the original buildings —valuable testaments to the region's architectural heritage—have been preserved, but also the traditional lifestyle that defines the very essence of Patagonia. This tour of the Estancia, founded over 100 years ago, is a true journey back in time. We begin with a map of the province and a historical introduction to livestock farming in Patagonia. We then walk through different areas of the Estancia, such as the vegetable garden and greenhouse, where we can sample some of the products, season permitting. We then visit the manor house and the shearing shed. In the latter building, the most emblematic of all ranch work, you can witness the traditional shearing and understand the wool grading process (seasonal only).

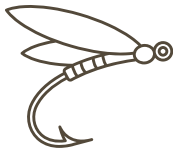
